This month I'd like to share a devotion with you that is written by Beth Moore in her book, <u>Believing</u> <u>God Day By Day</u>. In this devotion, Beth refers to the Old Testament account of Joshua and the bat-

tle of Jericho, where you will remember that God instructed Joshua to take the city of Jericho by marching his army repeatedly around the city walls for seven days. You will find the full account of this battle in the book of Joshua, chapter six.

Persevering in prayer isn't always easy - believe me, I know. Praying for the same thing, day in and day out, can become discouraging, but I hope this insight may help you stay focused and not grow weary - God is always up to something good!

"Sometimes we lay a crucial request before God, perhaps a life-and-death matter, and we want something fast and spectacular. Instead, God often directs us to keep walking around that Jericho, day after day, repeating the same fundamental steps while nothing seems to happen.

Oh, it will. We must never stop believing it will. But in the meantime, we've got to keep walking and keep circling no matter how many times we've done it before and no matter how many times we're yet to do it. We may want a constant dose of dramatics, but God enjoys seeing the perseverance of simple, daily devotion."

LWML Mission Grant Highlight June 2018



LWR Quilt & Kit Shipping Fund - \$80,000

For as long as the LWML has existed, Lutheran women have been making quilts to send to those in need. Since 1945 Lutheran World Relief (LWR) has been supplying these quilts (& kits) to those who need them most. Getting these items to the farthest reaches of the world can be complex and challenging. LWR has established a network of transportation, warehousing and distribution enabling the recipients to live better lives and to know the love of Jesus.

Lutheran World Relief ships between \$12 and \$13 million worth of quilts, blankets, baby care kits, personal care kits, school and fabric kits and soap to 20 about countries each year. It costs approximately \$1.5 million to run this program each year, and this LWML national grant of \$80,000 will help sustain the fund and support these costs. These treasured gifts are sent with love in the name of Jesus to remote areas around the world.
